Fred's Challenge 2025

The Bible is filled with promises on how God can change your life when you study His Word—"Do not let this Book of the Law depart from your mouth; meditate on it day and night, so that you may be careful to do everything written in it. Then you will be prosperous and successful." Joshua 1:8

It's never too late to start regularly reading Scripture, and we have a simple plan that can help you spend time in God's Word every day in the New Year.

When you decide to use the simple Fred's Challenge Bible reading plan, it will help you grow closer to Jesus Christ this year. This Challenge Guide contains suggested readings for every day of the year.

I, ______, pledge to do all I can to read through the New Testament of the Bible in 2025.

Read one chapter per day, Monday-Friday with Saturday and Sunday used as catchup days in case you missed one. Read or listen to 5 New Testament chapters per week x 52 weeks = 260 chapters. Invest time every day in Bible reading and prayer. Ask the Holy Spirit to help you understand what you are reading. Check off each chapter as you read it. On the next page, there is a reading schedule for you to keep.
