People have become well versed in Christian terminology but are remiss in the actual practice of Christ's principles and teachings. Our greatest need is not more Christianity but more true Christians.

Salvation is free to us, but it cost Jesus His life. It will also cost the sinner his or her sins when a person receives His gift. This does not mean that we have to clean up our lives in order to be saved. The Lord knows we don't have the power to do that. But we must come to Him in repentance, and then His Holy Spirit will take up residence and empower us to walk away from sin. That's why Jesus paid for our sins with His blood—to set us on a new path.

Pastor Marks Minute:

Life is full of new beginnings. Every morning begins a new day; every Sunday brings a new week; every January starts a new year.

Our Lord is the God of new beginnings, and that's the theme of Genesis.

The first words of the Bible are, "In the beginning God." Genesis 1:1

The very word Genesis means origin or beginning. Everyone who decided to follow the Lord needed a new beginning at some point, and often at many points in their lives. Think of Adam and Eve after they were driven out of the garden of Eden; Noah, after the flood; Abraham, who left his home in Ur; Jacob, whose life was one disaster after another until the Lord wrestled with him and blessed him.
