If you struggle like I occasionally do, listen to this, if you believe you are not enough, neither were 2 fish and 5 loaves enough, but when they were given to Jesus, He made them more than enough to feed thousands.

If you believe you are not worth much because of the hard times you've faced or maybe even because of some terrible decisions you've made, listen to this, yes, you have scars to prove you have a past, but guess what, Jesus Christ has scars to prove you have a future! You are enough! You are more than enough!

If you mistakenly believe you are not worth much, listen to this, a steak can cost \$10.00 at a supermarket, \$25.00 at a diner, and \$150.00 at a high-end restaurant. Same steak. The only thing that changed was its location.

The next time you feel worthless or undervalued, ask yourself if you are just in the wrong place, maybe even with the wrong people.

You see, Jesus values you, He declared, "I love you. You are to die for!"

Give your life to Jesus! He makes you more than enough.
