C. S. Lewis was a Christian author, theologian and college professor. Here he writes about true peace. His writing is informative and inspirational.

“The only reason atheists experience any peace at all is because God, in His mercy, allows it. Every calm breath, every moment of joy, every sense of stability is borrowed grace. Even those who deny Him live inside a world sustained by His patience and kindness. God is good even to those who reject Him. But do not confuse that with true peace. Worldly peace is temporary, circumstantial, fragile. It depends on health, money, distraction, or control. It fades the moment suffering arrives or death comes into view. That kind of peace cannot stand when the night gets long and the soul is forced to be honest. True peace is found only in Christ. It is not the absence of trouble but the presence of truth. Jesus said, “My peace I give to you. Not as the world gives do I give to you.” This peace fulfills because it reconciles us to our Creator, anchors us beyond death, and satisfies the soul the world can never reach. Everything else is borrowed comfort.” -C. S. Lewis

Thought You Should Know...

As many as 7.8% of high school students and 3.5% of junior high students currently use vape products. It is illegal to sell these products to kids under 21, but they are easy to get on-line. Smoking cigarettes is unhealthy, smoking e-cigarettes, especially at a young age, is a serious health threat. Using nicotine at a young age may make it harder to concentrate and learn or even control your mood and impulses. Nearly all e-cigarettes contain nicotine, which is extremely addictive. Plus, other toxic chemicals are added which may severely damage the heart, lung and brain in growing children, as well as adults.

The solution is flavored, so it tastes good. Most flavors were banned nationally in 2019, but mint and menthol are still allowed. Unfortunately, any flavor is allowed in inexpensive, disposable e-cigarettes which makes them popular with kids.

The vapor from e-cigarettes contains harmful chemicals (here are just a few of them):

Diacetyl – a chemical flavoring linked to a serious disease known as popcorn lung.

Benzene – a chemical found naturally in gasoline and known to raise the risk of leukemia.

Propylene Glycol – a food additive also used to make antifreeze and paint solvent.

Formaldehyde – a chemical linked to cancer.

If you have a junior or senior high student, please, take a few minutes and calmly and rationally bring up the topic of vaping. To begin, ask them how they feel about vaping.

Then, without judgement, ask them what they know and have experienced. Then share with them the risks to their health. If you have questions or need assistance, talk to your health care professional or contact the American Lung Association or visit:
